Our bachelor programs are organized in 3 years (corresponding to Bloc 1, Bloc 2, and Bloc 3, 180 ECTS credits) and our master programs are organized in 2 years (corresponding to Bloc 1 and Bloc 2, 120 ECTS credits). At the undergraduate level, most of the courses are taught in French. At the graduate level, most of the courses are taught in English.

Exchange students are allowed to take a combination of courses at the bachelor/undergraduate and master/graduate level. The international relations coordinator of the Faculty provides personalized academic support to exchange students regarding their choice of courses.

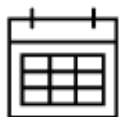

English Friendly Courses are open to exchange students with limited knowledge of French. The courses will be accessible to them thanks to the facilities put in place by the teaching teams in terms of access to documentation, interaction with teachers and for the course’s assessment. It is important to note that English-Friendly courses are not bilingual. Therefore, a passive knowledge of French is highly recommended. Exchange students who wish to take these courses are invited to express their interest when drawing their Learning Agreement and to make themselves known to the teaching staff from the first class.



Academic calendar

Fall Term: Mid-September – Last week of January

Teaching: 12 weeks, starting from mid- September

Winter exam session: from beginning of January until the end of January

Spring Term: Beginning of February – End of June

Teaching: 12 course weeks, starting at the beginning of February

Summer exam session: from the end of May until the end of June

A **re-sit exam session** is organized mid-August until the beginning of September.

No official language test is required, but we strongly advise international exchange students to make sure that their language skills will allow them to fully take part in all academic activities.

Accommodation on campus

The University of Namur offers a (limited) number of rooms to international students in its “International House”.

Health Insurance

Students from the EU: European Health Insurance Card

All other students: Legally required health insurance (such a comprehensive health insurance for students can be bought through UNamur and it costs approximately € 40,00 per month)



Integration weeks (Fall) and days (Spring)

Organized every year before the beginning of the Fall term (first two weeks of September), the orientation weeks consist of French or English as a second language courses (worth 3 ECTS credits) and cultural and social activities to facilitate the integration of international students.

For Spring semester, a shorter event (without language classes) is organized during three days in early February.



Course of French as a second language

During your stay you can attend a beginner, intermediate or advanced course (3 ECTS credits, 2 hours of teaching per week). A placement test is organized at the beginning of each term.

Free of charge for exchange students.



Cost of living

Housing: approximately 365 Euros/month for university-managed housing (housing offered by the private market is about 200 Euros more expensive)

Living expenses: approximately 600-700 Euros/month
