ÖREBRO UNIVERSITY

Örebro University was granted full university status in 1999 and is now one of Sweden's most expansive universities, with 15,000 students and 1,500 staff. The university offers 60 undergraduate programmes and 20 postgraduate programmes, as well as 600 single courses in some 45 subjects. Some of these courses and programmes are taught in English.

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

At the start of the semester, an orientation programme is organised for all exchange students by the International Office, in cooperation with the student association ESN Örebro. During the orientation programme a number of social events will be arranged together with Swedish students. There will also be practical information about everything from accommodation to healthcare services, and students will learn how to find their way around campus. There is a fee for participating in some of the social events of the orientation programme.

HOUSING

All exchange students are guaranteed student accommodation provided that we have received the application on time. All student accommodation has shops, healthcare centres and other services within easy reach. The average cost for housing is 3,500 SEK (approx 326 EUR/366 USD)* per month.



COST OF LIVING

The average cost of living per month is around 8,800 SEK (approx 820 EUR/920 USD)* including rent.

STUDY SYSTEM

At Swedish universities, courses and modules are mainly studied one at a time. For example, a student takes a full-time course of 7.5 ECTS credits for five weeks, which also includes examination. When the course is completed, the student takes up the next course. Studies are measured in ECTS credits and 1.5 ECTS credits are equivalent to one week of full-time study.

COURSES AND COURSE LOAD

Exchange students can choose from across the range of courses offered in English at Örebro University, as long as they meet the prerequisites and as long as the courses are not full. Course offerings can be found on our website: www.oru.se/exchange. Exchange students are expected to be full-time students and take 30 credits per semester.

NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Please note that exchange students need to be officially nominated by their home university. All partner universities are notified when the online nomination form opens. The application for admission and housing is webbased. The only supporting document needed is a transcript in English stating all courses, grades and credits at university level. However, for students applying for music courses, recordings are also required. The link to the application portal is published on our website: www.oru.se/exchange when the application opens.
